

Student survey results

Throughout the year we survey students to see how they feel about their school, their wellbeing, their learning and their relationships with students and staff. These surveys provide us with information about what is going well in our school and where our future directions might be. Students were surveyed in June 2020 and September 2020 with the intention of monitoring wellbeing throughout the Covid-19 pandemic.

From June to September we saw significant increases in positive feelings towards school and school life: We saw an increase from 50% of students who indicated that they always enjoy going to school to 70% of students indicating that they always enjoy going to school. Overall, in September 93% of students indicated that they always or mostly enjoyed going to school.

School pride grew from 86% of students in June always feeling proud of their school to 96% of students in September. Student enjoyment in learning grew from 59% of students always enjoying learning at school to 78% of students in September. Overall in September 97% of students always or mostly enjoy learning at school. 93% of students felt that teachers had high expectations for students to do their best when learning. A graphical representation of results will be displayed along the school fence next week.

Partial Absences from a teacher's perspective
