FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Tell Them From Me

This Term, our school will be participating in the Partners in Learning parent survey, another part of the Tell Them From Me suite of surveys (student, teacher and parent surveys) on student engagement. The survey asks parents and carers questions about different factors that are known to impact on student wellbeing and engagement.

Running this survey will help our school understand parents' and carers' perspectives on their child's experience at school. These include: communication between parents/carers and staff, activities and practices at home and parent/carer views on the school's support of learning and behaviour. This valuable feedback will help our school make practical improvements.

The survey is conducted entirely online on smartphones, iPads, tablets, laptops or computers. The survey will typically take 15 minutes or less to complete and is completely confidential. The parent survey will be conducted over Term 3 and early Term 4. Although participating in the survey is entirely voluntary, your responses are very much appreciated.

The survey is available in 23 languages.

NAPLAN Online Readiness Test

The school readiness test is for schools transitioning to NAPLAN Online in 2022 and is designed to check a school's readiness to conduct NAPLAN Online. Our school will participate in the readiness test in Week 5.

The readiness test consists of two 40 minute assessments: an omnibus test with reading, conventions of language and numeracy items, and a writing task. Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in the school readiness test. Year 3 students do not participate in the writing assessment. Further details will go to families of students in Years 3 and 5.

Staff Professional Learning

The team at BPS are committed to continuing to build on our knowledge and skills by participating in high impact professional learning focused on effective literacy and numeracy teaching strategies. Teachers have spent the last two Mondays with our Instructional Leader Mrs Sharlee Cassidy focusing on the teaching and learning cycle and effective assessment practices.

Assistant Principal Curriculum Instruction Position

We are currently recruiting for the new role of Assistant Principal Curriculum and Instruction (APCI) for 1 day per week (0.2fte) starting in 2022. The APCI position is a leadership role dedicated to ensuring that literacy and numeracy knowledge and skills are embedded in curriculum and assessment; high quality teaching practices are enhanced; and the capabilities of middle leaders are strengthened in literacy and numeracy instruction. It shares the broader educational imperatives of the Assistant Principal position but with an explicit focus on the leadership of effective, evidence-based literacy and numeracy teaching and assessment practices for improved student learning outcomes across the curriculum.

The Assistant Principal, Curriculum and Instruction provides high support and guidance to enhance teacher growth and development in literacy and numeracy and strengthens schoolwide instructional capabilities across the curriculum for middle and senior leaders.

School Visitor Check-in

The Department of Education, in partnership with ServiceNSW, has developed a digital solution that will simplify the sign-in experience for visitors and school staff and provide a streamlined, accurate and secure record system for schools. The School Visitor Check-in is mandatory for every school, in line with NSW Public Health Orders. At this stage, parents and carers entering a school to drop off or pick up children are not required to check-in. This also applies if they are picking up or dropping children off to an OOSCH provider.
