

#### Liquid Nitrogen Show

### **Road Safety**

We ask you to help keep our students safe and support our road safety plan by:

- Parking along the school side of the road
- The first car to arrive parks at the end of the school boundary (at the large gum tree) with the following cars to park behind (this reduces the need for people to reverse park which can be unsafe with children around)
- Avoid leaving large gaps between cars (this takes up lots of space and reduces available parking spots)
- Share the parking and pick up routines with other family members or carers who collect your child
- Avoid driving over the footpath

• Model safe road behaviours by going around the tree (which serves as a round about) rather than cutting across the road to park.

Working together to support road safety will make our busy little road a much safer place for your children.
