Class 3-4

In mathematics 3/4 are focusing on place value up to 4-digit numbers. The students have engaged in a range of hands-on activities that provide opportunities for them to make, write, expand and add on to 2- and 3-digit numbers. We are also focusing on counting forwards and backwards on and off the decade to improve our accuracy and fluency.

In writing, 3/4 have been learning about descriptive writing, using our senses to create an image of an object, place or experience. As part of our sessions 3/4 have been picking vegetables from the garden to help provide a hands-on sensory experience.

Covid-safe settings



We move to symptomatic rapid antigen testing for staff and students, enhanced cleaning, ventilation, ample supplies of soap and sanitiser, mask wearing for adults and provision of masks for children, staff vaccination, no non-essential visitors on site, student cohorting where



Adults to wear masks in Primary settings until March 7. Primary school students are strongly recommended to wear well-fitted masks indoors.



Any student or staff member who is unwell and/or displays symptoms of COVID-19 will be asked to go home and stay until they can complete a RAT or PCR test. If symptoms continue, they should stay at home and take another RAT in 24 hours or have a PCR test. If the second RAT or initial PCR test result is negative and they are displaying no symptoms OR they are diagnosed as another condition such as hayfever, the student or staff member can return to school.
